# (PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Mini Reflection: The journey of the magi would have been treacherous and uncomfortable. Imagine the peace in their hearts as they approached the young Messiah and fell to their knees. The new, vibrant awareness of what their own purpose was. It was an epiphany for them. It can be the same for us.

The Answer Have you ever had an epiphany?

I'll confess that I've never spent much time reflecting on the term "epiphany." In my head, there has always been a strict separation of church and state when it comes to this word. I think of the religious feast of the Epiphany, when we celebrate the magi's encounter with the Christ Child, as totally distinct from our modern understanding of the ancient Greek word epipháneia, which means "manifestation" or "appearance."

"I've had an epiphany," I have said many times before, and what I mean is that I have come to a long-awaited realization. I have received the answer to a question which has perplexed me, perhaps troubled me. I now know what course of action I must take.

"Today is the Epiphany," I say to my children when we make a king cake and bring the little magi figures to our Nativity beneath the Christmas tree (which will, after today, be put back into storage, for the Christmas season has come to its fulfillment).

And I've always thought I meant I was saying two very different things.

But today, I ponder the journey of the magi, one that must have often been treacherous and uncomfortable. I think about their meeting with Herod, a situation that certainly was fraught with tension and fear. And I imagine the feeling in their hearts as they approached the young Messiah and fell to their knees. I think of the peace they must have felt. The new, vibrant awareness of what their own purpose was.

It was an epiphany for them — a discovery of truth. An answer.

It should be the same for us. ©LPi

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The Celebration of the Epiphany is celebrated this Sunday. Jesus, today, is revealed as the light of the nations as we celebrate the adoration of the Christ Child by the Magi. Today, not taking away our focus from the New-Born King, the Church recognizes the Coming of the Magi, The Three Kings. The Epiphany honors and recognizes the three wise men making their journey from the East to find Jesus and worship Him.

When the Magi found the place where the Christ Child was, they rejoiced exceedingly and knelt before Jesus and worshiped him. It was an appropriate response as they found themselves in the presence of the King of Kings. Then they opened their treasures and presented gifts to Jesus. The three gifts were gold, frankincense, and myrrh. These were not random gifts. They were each significant at the time and have important meanings for us today. The gold points to Jesus' royalty, the frankincense to his divinity, and the myrrh to his humanity. These gifts tell the story of how God Himself came down from Heaven as our King (gold) to fulfill his priestly duties (frankincense) and eventually die for our sins (myrrh). Through these gifts, the Magi "preached" the gospel in a very real and tangible way.

As we celebrate The Epiphany, we ought to consider our journeys from our homes to come here to Transfiguration Church to bow down and worship the Lord. How important it is for us to make this journey each week for the Celebration of the Eucharist. Our presence, gathered together at the Table of the Lord, listening to the Word of God and receiving The Eucharist, gives witness that the Lord manifests Himself and we have come before Him offering to Him the gifts of ourselves. Along with our physical presence at the Table of the Lord, as the Three Wise Men brought their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, what gifts are bringing to the Lord? The Church asks us to be stewards in the House of the Lord. We are asked to share of our time, talent and treasure. These are all precious commodities with all that is taking place in our lives but they are indeed worthy offerings to the Lord. Then, strengthened in our faith through our participation in the Eucharist, as participating members of the Church here at Transfiguration, we make our way back to our homes, our workplaces, our daily activities. Each of us in our own way then, like the Magi, are preaching the Gos-

My brothers and sister in Christ, in imitation of the Three Wise Men, come let us bow down and worship.

#### January 5, 2025 The Epiphany of the Lord **Matthew 2:1-12**

Have you ever wondered why the magi had gold, frankincense, and myrrh? Matthew's Gospel tells us, "Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh" (Matt. 2:11). Why are these things their "treasures"? One possible answer is they were magicians and astrologers, and these three items were the tools of their questionable trade. In offering them to Christ, they demonstrate that they will cease using such items to predict or control life. They place this baby-king, the God of Israel, at the center of their lives, and not their own devices of control, manipulation and prediction.

Isn't that what we need to do, too? Consider, for example, the magical power of money, symbolized by the magi's gold. Seemingly whatever we ask of money, it does. It wields a god-like power over the world. It can predict the future by guaranteeing better outcomes for us — which is why it is such a tempting alternative to trusting in God. The problem is such absolute trust in money enslaves us to the economic forces that make money so powerful. In paying homage to Jesus with "gold" (i.e., tithing), we participate in his authority over (and therefore freedom from) the magical sway of money.

What things in your life do you use to predict or control your future? What in your life seems to give you power over the world? Those are your treasures. Are you tired of feeling enslaved to them? Find a way to open them and give them to Christ, and you will be freer.
