

My Sisters and Brothers in the Lord,

2025 is A Jubilee Holy Year, the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord, an "event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church." The concept of "Jubilee" has its origins in the Book of Leviti-



cus (chapter 25) as a special year of reconciliation, pilgrimage, and coming home. Pope Francis has designated the 2025 Holy Year as a time to renew ourselves as "Pilgrims of Hope."

Since the solemn opening of the 2025 Jubilee Year which took place on Christmas Eve, already over 500,000 pilgrims from all over the world have passed through the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica at the Vatican. Hundreds of groups have already made their pilgrimage with the Jubilee cross leading them as they move prayerfully along Via della Conciliazione, to reach the Basilica. This is a very significant beginning to the Jubilee Year. The tremendous amount of people making the journey gives an important witness and we here in the Diocese of Oakland are encouraged to do the same.

For this year's Jubilee, Our Holy Father decreed that the only "Holy Doors" will be in Rome. That being said, the Cathedral of Christ the Light is still designated as a special place of pilgrimage to gain the Holy Year Indulgence.

The Opening Celebration for the Jubilee Year took place this past Sunday, January 19, at the 11:00 AM Mass celebrated at the Cathedral of Christ the Light in Oakland. Instead of a Holy Door, the emphasis here in the Diocese of Oakland will focus on a Holy Cross. The cross comes from the Old Mission San Jose. It is the foundation cross used by the Franciscan friars in 1797 to establish the Mission. The Cross was carried in procession on Sunday and has been placed in a prominent place for veneration in the Cathedral for the duration of the Year. Making this Spiritual Journey and fulfilling the obligations, a Plenary Indulgence – remission of temporal punishment due to sin – can be received.

Many have already entered into the spirit of the Jubilee by taking part in the opening celebrations of the Holy Year such as were held this past Sunday, January 19, at the Cathedral of Christ the Light in Oakland and in dioceses throughout the world. Celebrations will be taking place in our Diocese and in our Churches throughout this Jubilee Year

January 26, 2025 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21

A young couple in my parish told me they were expecting their second child, a baby boy. I knew that their five-year old only child Emma had been desperately wanting to be a big sister for years, so I said, "Emma must have been so happy when you told her the news." "Actually," they said, "she burst into tears. She wanted a baby sister!" How often in life God wonderfully fulfills our desires and we are sad because we don't approve of the way he does it. We want to control the gift and the delivery method.

The same thing occurs in the Gospel this week when Jesus announces in his hometown that the promise of an Anointed One bringing glad tidings to the poor is "fulfilled in your hearing" (Luke 4:21). After a moment of elation, his fellow townsfolk realize this man is the way God is fulfilling his promises, and they erupt into a violent outburst. So Jesus departs. How sad for them.

Every single Sunday at Mass, including this one, some version of this happens to many of us. God's word announces the fulfillment of God's promises in Christ, and we easily overlook or disdain it. His way is almost never according to our narrow expectations. What's required of us is to set these aside, and to embrace a new openness to God's gifts, no matter how he wishes to give them. God is fulfilling his promises the way He likes — why be sad?
