

#### **September 14, 2025** The **Exaltation** Cross John 3:13-17

One of my favorite movies is the 1991 comedy What About Bob? Bill Murray plays a troubled, paranoid hypochondriac named Bob Wiley who innocently but annoyingly hounds Dr. Leo Marvin, played by Richard Dreyfuss. Bob is paralyzed by his fear of, well, everything, and is convinced the psychologist can heal him. But Dr. Marvin's failed attempts to heal Bob end up driving the doctor to attempt to murder Bob. He fails. The surprise is that, having faced death head on, Bob is suddenly healed. He attributes his healing to Dr Marvin for break-through "death therapy." In facing the cause of his deepest illness and dysfunction, Bob is healed.

Underneath this light-hearted comedy is a dead-serious resonance with this week's feast: the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Christ is lifted up on the cross to force us to face the truth of sin and death. In that reckoning we find healing. Like Moses' snake on a pole, the cross says: this is what is causing your sickness - rebellion, disobedience, sin. Look at it! Don't run from it. Now seeing it exposed, we see life. We see our physician mercifully healing us. In this sense, we are all like Bob Wiley. The "death therapy" of the cross is our only hope for healing.

This week I invite you to "exalt the cross." If you don't have one in your house, get one. Use it for prayer. Gaze on it frequently. It teaches us to not be afraid. It heals us.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord,

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross, the one symbol most often identified with Jesus and his Church is the cross.

This Sunday, September 14th, we celebrate **The** Feast of The Exaltation of the Holy Cross. For many, the cross is seen as a sign of suffering, but by Christ's love shown in the Paschal Mystery, the cross has become for us a sign of triumph and victory, the sign of God, who is love itself.

We often make the Sign of the Cross over ourselves. We make it before prayer to help fix our minds and hearts on God. We make it after prayer, hoping to stay close to God. At Baptism, the celebrant, parents, and godparents make the sign on the forehead of the baptized as a visible sign that they have been claimed by Christ. So, please look to the cross often. Make the Sign of the Cross reverently.

As you make the sign of the cross keep in mind that we bring our whole selves to God—our minds, souls, bodies, wills, thoughts, hearts—everything we are and will become. Entrust yourself to the Lord who suffered and died upon the cross for us and our salvation. And finally, looking at the cross, let us respond to the invitation "Come, let us worship." Looking to the cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ let us hear the echoing of these words... "Bless us who find salvation in the cross of Christ. May we always recognize His glory. We ask this through Christ, crucified and exalted, who is Lord forever and ever. Amen."
